MORBID APPEARANCES

5/5 hair brown, The body was well nourished but very pallid. The left thigh and leg were slightly swollen and the veins of the leg were mapped out by means of red streaks. A few soft bands of adhesion connected the posterior and inferior part of the R lung with the chest wall.

Pneumonia The lungs contained rather less blood than normal, but, speaking comparatively, the posterior parts appeared congested. On careful inspection this slightly deeper red tint was found to depend on the presence of numerous lobular slightly congested areas. This condition coincided with a distinct roughness of all parts concerned; but the

Heart 11 oz furnished with fat. The R auricle contained one and half coloured. In the clot of similar nature. The valves endocardium. The tissue was pale and pressure of the finger, yet fatty disease.

Liver 49 oz pallid and fatty.

Kidneys 8 oz - pale, rather fatty to the touch.

CASE

No history obtainable.

Nov. 25th The patient was admitted in a delirious condition. She was well nourished, but anaemic to a marked degree. She complained of severe pain about the R. mastoid process, shooting down into the neck & up into the head; of thumping sensations in the chest on expiration, and nausea after drinking anything hot. The tongue was thickly coated with white. The bowels had been confined for 2 days. (S. m. pil. Cr. i. cal. gr. 1/2. st. S. Salic. 3p.)

Nov. 27th Delirium marked during the night of the 26th. Pain said to be less. Bowels not yet open.

Nov. 30th Two doses of Salic omitted on account of the delirium. The dose reduced to 3g. Omnis. salis, appl. recta Empl. caustandis, et s. st. Calomel. gr. v (1/2 post horas 1/2 Hor. Senna.)

Dec. 1st Painless: complains of frontal headache + noise in the ears. Bowels opened by the calomel.

Dec. 2nd (S. m. horis T. t. Brom. 3p i. Hot. T. t. Sod.; s. grise. 3p. G. gall. 3ir.) Delirium lessened: Six loose motions since the 2nd.

Dec. 8th Complained of much pain about both temporo-massillary articulations, and could hardly open his mouth in consequence. About noon she became very drowsy. From this the condition showed no marked change: drowsiness alternating with low muttering delirium. The bowels were either confined or much relaxed. The pulse became very frequent & weak. On Dec. 8th the R. knee was found to be swollen and painful. It continued so till death.

(Subsequent treatment:- 8th S. ivth hor. Ammon. Salic. qd; Pot. Brom. 3g; Hot. P. t. Sod; 9th S. st. Calomendius gr. iv; s. post horis 1/2 Hor. Senna, She sank gradually and died without further symptoms. There was no rigidity of neck or limbs.

5/5 The body was well nourished but very pallid. The left hair brown, thigh and leg were slightly swollen and the veins of the leg were mapped out by means of red streaks. In the few soft bands of adhesion connected the posterior and inferior part of the R lung with the chest wall.

Lungs The lungs contained rather less blood than normal; but, speaking comparatively, the posterior parts appeared congested. On careful inspecting this slightly deeper red tint was found to depend on the presence of numerous lobular slightly congested areas. This condition coincided with a distinct toughness of the parts concerned; but there was no pneumonia. A small amount of serum could be squeezed out of both bases; but it was noticed that the exuded fluid was not blood stained showing how slight was the congestion.

Heart 11 oz furnished with fat externally, contracted. The R auricle contained some soft clot half colourless and half coloured. In the L ventricle was a small clot of similar nature. The valves endocardium and aorta were normal. The tissue was pale and soft, yielding to a slight pressure of the finger, yet not as soft as in confirmed fatty disease.

Liver 49 oz pallid and fatty.
Kidneys 8 oz pale, rather fatty to the touch.
Spleen 5 oz good consistence, Malpighian bodies small but well marked; no congestion. In the splenic substance was a small oblong yellowish white lobulated firm deposit, nearly reaching the surface, but not connected with any thickening or depression of the capsule. It resembled a
