MORBID APPEARANCES.

General appearance - Body fairly well marked - muscular - PM Rigidity well marked - in lower limbs, neck & lower jaw, slight in upper limbs - PM lividity slight w.t. 10 ft. mottled - Edema of face, legs & feet - Scrotum Cyanosis of lips. Hair Reddish brown - scanty on the face - Pupils slightly dilated right slightly larger than the left - Irides bluish grey - Conjunctivae slight icteric tinge.

Pleurae. Left contains a little clear serum. Right obliterated by fibrous adhesion.

Lungs. Left 29 oz. - Patches of consolidation measuring on an average $\frac{1}{2}$ inch. Right 38 oz. Similar in size on both lungs, but more abundant in the right than in the left, these patches have a slight brownish tinge but are mostly of a pinkish-red color, the rest of the organ is adenomatous & congested.

Hybrid Heart. Apparently normal. - Pericardium a few ounces of clear serum. Op. 25 very large - Valves ^{annular} over wh. of left ventricle.

Right outside $\frac{3}{4}$ wall $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ inch in thickness, contained a pretty large amount of pale fluid blood, with a small dechlorinated clot - Right auricle distended with a large amount of dark red blood - Left ventricle walls much thickened $\frac{3}{4}$ to 1 inch in thickness contents soft - Left auricle partly collapsed partly dark red - cavity enlarged. Left auricle walls thickened cavity full of soft clot. Valves Tricuspid healthy almost easily 4 small fungus. Pulmonary healthy. Mitral admits three large fungus. easily - the free edge is covered with fibrous vegetation which extends along the chordae tendineae to the anterior papillary muscle from the upper part of which a small fibrous polypous fungus projects into the ventricular cavity. Aortic valve ^{annular} anteriorly ^{in left ventricle} ~~the aortic valve is~~ an diseased, fibrous vegetation growing from the cusps anterior and also from the cardiac surface of these valves, the vegetation covering also the anterior aspect of the aorta amp of the mitral. Vegetation was also found on the posterior cusp of the mitral and the adjacent part of the auricular endocardium. Arteries healthy above the valves.

Peritoneum. Clear. Some yellow serum abundant in its cavity.

CASE.

History.

The patient was a gardener. He gave no history of rheumatism and denied having had syphilis. He was in good health till two months before he came to St. George's. He then "caught a chill", and began to suffer from pain in his loins. A doctor who saw him diagnosed "inflammation of the kidneys". The chief symptoms from which he suffered were, headache, transient but recurrent oedema of the ankles, difficulty of micturition, scanty urine & great weakness.

Admission.

The patient was pale. He complained of weakness. His appetite was gone, his tongue was coated, his bowels were open. The action of his neck pulsated. His radial pulse was full and collapsing. The base of the apex of his heart was in the 6th space $\frac{3}{4}$ inch external to the nipple. A musical systolic murmur was heard at the apex and in the axilla, and towards the base of the heart. A double murmur was heard at the base and at the ensiform opening. A few alveolar wheezes were heard over the lungs. There was no ascites and no enlargement of the liver. The man's urine had a sp. gr. of 1010 and was acid and contained $\frac{1}{2}$ albumen. He had no retinitis. His legs were slightly oedematous.

Treatment.

The man was treated with Castoreum and a mixture containing 3j -

On September 19th a distinct rough sound was heard at the apex like the systolic murmur = the other murmur was the same. The man's urine contained granular epithelium and fatty casts. On the 29th he had no oedema and his general condition was better. He passed more urine. Early in October, however, he had much cough and dyspnoea, and at the 6th he again
