MORBID APPEARANCES

body well nourished.
Lungs presented small caseous nodules
Heart 3 oz normal, walls of left ventricle rather thick.
Liver 19 oz. firm, surface rough & granular from small nodules of scattered tubercle.
Spleen 2 oz. patches on capsule
Brain convolutions flattened, ventricles distended. minute dots of tubercle in arachnoid, best seen on left side; on under surface of right middle lobe at fore part was a round tumour, the size of a walnut, hard, with an indented surface, it was partly adherent to the Dura Mater, the latter was inflamed & the bone beneath was rough & diseased. The interior of the tumour was caseating. The brain around was no much softened. But the tumour was almost detached. On under surface of right cerebellar hemisphere was another hard mass, not so distinct or well defined & smaller, this was also caseating in the interior.
The brain generally was softened.

Lymphatics The mesenteric glands were enlarged.


"Consumption" in the family.

She cut her teeth at 2 1/2 yrs, walked at 2 yrs, then was taken off her fat till 3 yrs old.

She had never been a healthy child but never had suffered from any special illness.

Last November she left this Hosp after treatment of 3 mos. for "tumour in the stomach".



On the 12th complained of pain in the stomach.

The child lay in a drowsy condition, apparently asleep, with the hands drawn up & grinding the teeth. Skin hot - head not more so than rest of body. Fair hair.

No squinting, pupils equal & acting. P. 76 intermittent every 2° or every 3° beat.

She complained of pain in the head, lying with her hands under it, & rubbing it when awake.

Pain also in the abdomen - slight tenderness. Tongue a white coating & projecting papillae.

The bowels had not been open since the 4th. Temp 100°.

(Post.) lungs no abnormal signs - no cough. Hst. Annual at 39. At 11 hours

Hstart. Loud pulsation. It intermitted every 2° or every 3° beat.

She remained in the same drowsy condition, not sleeping much at night. When roused whined & would not speak. The bowels had not been open. Tongue much cleaner

The patient's mother has had 14 children; 10 of whom have died young, of diarrhoea, toothache & 4 qd in convulsions.

She cut her teeth at 2 1/2 yrs, walked at 2 yrs, then was taken off her feet till 3 yrs old. She had never been a healthy child but never had suffered from any special illness.

Last November she left this Hosp after treatment of 3 mos. for a tumour in the stomach (ad. no. 1274 Reg. 1878-9.) Since then she has been going on very well & seemed to grow fat.

In Jan. 1879 she was under Dr. Carter for ulcers on fingers - 2 mos ago under the house surgeon for an umbilical hernia.

The week before admission she began to complain of feeling tired & ill; asked to be laid down & couldn't walk, staggering when put on her feet.

Her appetite during this week had failed, she vomited almost everything she swallowed since the 11th inst & since the day before admission had kept nothing on her stomach.

Diarrhoea with green motions from the 7th to 11th inst. at wh. date she came for advice to this hospital.

From the 11th she was very drowsy, never waking up unless roused, then was rousable. She had no convulsions nor squinting before admission, nor headache.

On the 12th complained of pain in the stomach.
