MORBID APPEARANCES.

Gen. appear. Height 5 ft 2. Muscular. Abdomen tympanitic.

Lungs. 4 lb 12 oz. Firm, old, pleuritic adhesions on right side. At right apex some old tuberculous masses of obliterant tubercle. The whole of the lower lobe of the right lung was quite solid, grey in colour, friable, sucking in water. Base of left lung much engorged, no solidification.

Heart. 18 oz. Muscular, left ventricle firmly contracted, no tubular disease. Right side filled with clot.

Hair. 3 lbs. 11 oz. Healthy.

Spleen. 6 oz. Not enlarged, but very soft and friable.

Kidneys. 16 oz. Congested, healthy in structure.

Intestines. The only change was in the mesentery, here and there the glands were enlarged, hyperemic, shining on the surface of the gut like small red split-peas. The centre of one or two of them was ulcerated, and purulent. There was no evident enlargement of the glands of the mesentery, and no blood in the villous contents.



CASE.

History. Father is in family - father died of it. Patient a police constable & in excellent health - varicella in 1881. Had been quite well up to Sunday, March 14th when he had slight rigor - sweat sore - dysuria & painful, pain in limbs & all over body on 15th. Cough since 16th morn, when diarrhoea slight. Lab. continuing, stools dark.

Admission. Strongly built man - T coated with bran coat. P. 96. Resp 36. pain referred to sternum on deep breath. Temp 102.4°. Heart sounds normal. Lungs - R side pneumonia fair - breathing clear - a few crepitant blowing. Higher pitch of peritoneal note - sharp metallic clicks in party as far as 4th rib - costochondral pain referred to L side of sternum as far as 3rd space. Periorbita. Pharynx congested - mouth relaxed, slight spots of excretion on tonsils. Glands under jaw swollen - tender. urine acid, sp gr 1014. no albumen. Herpes on lips.

Progress. Though not in a very serious condition on admission, he developed each day a very high temperature. T became more brusque - & motions were loose & in number, no spots on abdomen. Resp 40. expectoril. Tussis hacking and like a R here, with sharp inspirations - moist rales on L side in front - on March 30th urine had the same off-white cast - a small abscess burst over 1st lumbar vertebra - patient became worse - no profuse or localized tenderness in flanks. Semidivisions - motions 2 but not very loose - urine albuminous - temperature persistently above 103°. Typhoid symptom increased. abdomen tender. But no spots appeared in the course of the disease - delirium more marked - scales on teeth & lips - He passed all motions awake under him - & from that time on till 2nd appt. he passed all motions awake under him - & from that time on till 2nd appt.

MORBID APPEARANCES.

Gen. appear. Height 5' 2. Muscular. Abdomen tympanitic.

Lungs. 416. 12 oz. Four old, pleuric adhesions on right side - at right apex some old tuberculous masses of obliterant tubercle. The whole of the lower lobe of the right lung was quite black, grey in colour, placid, sinking in water. Base of left lung much congested, no solidification.

Heart. 18 oz. Muscular, left ventricle finely contracted, no valvular disease. Right side filled with old.

Skin. 316. 11 oz. Healthy.

Uterus. 6 oz. Not enlarged, but very soft and pliable.

Kidneys. 16 oz. Congested, healthy in structure.

Intestine. The only change was in the colon, here and there the glands were enlarged, hyperemic, showing on the surface of the gut like small red split-peas. The centre of one or two of them was ulcerated, and purulent. There was evident enlargement of the glands of the mesentery, and no blood on the skin surface.

McNeill.

History:

Pather's in family - father died of it. Patient a police constable & in excellent health - Varicella in 1881. Had been quite well up to Sunday March 14th: when had slight rigor - throat sore - delirious painful pains in limbs & all over body on 18th. Cough since 16th morn, when dimpled slightly, but continuing, nocturnal.

Admission.

Strongly built man - P coated with bran coat. P 96. Res 26, pain referred to sternum on deep breath - Temp 102° 4. Heart sounds normal. Lungs - R side percuencia fair & breathing clear - a few crepitacions & rales. Upper pituitary percutaneous note - sharp metallic clicks in front as far as 4th rib - costochondritis pain referred to L side of sternum as far as 3rd space. Throat. Pharynx coated & swollen, slight spots of excretion on tonsils. Glands under jaw swollen - tender. urine acid, sp gr 1014. no albumen. No热血 on lips.

Progress.

Through not in a very severe condition on admission, he developed each day a very high temperature. He became more lame - & motions were loose. 5 in number, no spots on abdomen. Res 40. expect. nil. Tympanitis and liver at R here, with sharp calcifications - moist rales on L side in front - on March 20th urine had 8 to 10 hairs of anti-sarcocysts - a small abscess burst over 1st lumbar vertebra - & patient became worse - no joltling or localized tenderness in flanks. Semi delirious - motions 2 but not very loose - urine albuminous - Temperature persistently above 103° - Typhoid symptom increased. abdomen tender. But no spots appeared in the course of the disease - delirium now marked - Scales on teeth & lips - He passed all motions & water under him - & from that time relapsed into a state of semi-coma - His face was dusky, mouth wide open. Soreness accumulated - & dropped down to 100 - but became watery - tension of hands marked - he was absolutely markless in afternoon of 3rd morn - but rallied. though never spoke - & relapsing again into the acute typhoid state he died in morning of 4th morn.
