Anasarca A considerable amount of clear serum in the peritoneal cavity.



CASE

History. For the last twelve years the patient had been subject to cough, always in the winter; & varying in duration according to the state of the weather, in the summer it did not leave him altogether, he was not laid up from work until the winter of 79-80, the fog then prevailing made him much worse than usual. For 14 weeks previous to admission the cough had been very troublesome but he continued to work till the middle of January, on the 30th Jan. he had to lay up in bed altogether, the legs commencing to swell about that time. Besides these progressively increasing shortness of breath was complained of, & oed. palp.

On Admission Feb. 4. The patient was extremely cyanosed; breathing was distressed; anxious expression of face. Oedema of legs. Barrel shaped chest. T. 99. P. 120. weak. R. 32. Lungs slightly dull all over the back: general bronchitis. fine crepitant rales & rhonchi. Heart: Diminished area of dulness: heart sounds rather distant: no murmur detectible.

The patient was much distressed on admission; 2 1/2 hrs. afterward he was bled from the R. arm to ℥ijij (the blood was thick & flowed slowly); he was relieved by the operation: the pulse improved in strength. The patient passed a quiet night, with but little sleep, in the morning the cyanosis tho' considerable was less than on admission.



CASE

History.

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Feb. 5th

R. 32. Cough a little better: thick, limpy, useless sputum. - No cardiac murmur detectible.

Urine. acid, clear: orange: sp. gr. 1015: a trace of album.

Feb. 6th

Ether, Brandy, Ammon Carb, were prescribed. Pil. Calc. Co. v. on the night of the 4th. Hyd. Sulphur. gr. iij. Calc. Sulph. Co. 3j. on the morn. of the 6th after wh. the bowels were moved twice.

Chest: sounds were less moist: Rales chiefly at the base. Harsh murmur short & gasping. The cough continued, the dyspnoea was freq. aggravated by the flatulence after his meals. The sputum was copious, thick green & almost white.

Feb. 9

Heart: A loud blowing systolic murmur at loudest: at apex, heard at base & also at the R. of the sternum in the hypochondrium.

The cyanosis fluctuated, was always very marked. The oedema persisted.

Dyspnoea was sometimes less than at others but always considerable: complete orthopnoea.

On the 10th Feb a blister was applied to the chest, without apparent improvement.

The bowels were moved after repetition of the Calomel & Jalap on various dates.

During the last 10 or 12 days of life, the cyanosis & dyspnoea, cough & expect. all inc. much he slept but little. R. Digitalis seems to have proved of most service: Ammoniacum: squilla.

Pot. Aet. or Brandey & Gin were freely administered.
